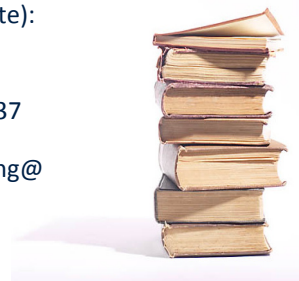

Mentoring Program





Our goal

OASBO's goal in offering a mentoring program is to help individuals succeed in the school business profession and to attract and retain the caliber of people required to successfully manage school business and operations.

Program Eligibility

Any supervisor or director level OASBO member (Associate or Professional) from any school business specialization is eligible to participate in the program. (i.e. Business Manager, Food Service Supervisor/Director, Treasurer, Transportation Supervisor/Director). *(It is not designed as an internship program for Business Manager or Treasurer licensure).*

Program Fees

Most of the mentoring program fees are included in your OASBO membership dues, however, each protégé will be charged \$100.

How it Works

The OASBO Mentoring Program is driven by both the protégé and the mentor so the match is critical. During the official matching process, OASBO takes into consideration the demographics, location, areas of specialization, and any special requests and needs of the protégé.

Once a mentor is chosen and training is complete, and if both are comfortable, an agreement is signed that explains responsibilities, time commitments and other details of the program. Mentoring program guides, tips and resources are given to both individuals. Most communication will take place by phone and email but it is recommended that the mentor spend approximately one day/month in face to face meetings with the protégé with additional visits arranged if mutually agreed upon.

Mentor/Protégé Training and Support

For mentors to receive contact hours for mentoring and a \$100 OASBO seminar credit, they are required to attend an orientation program/meeting. Protégés will receive contact hours and will attend a facilitated orientation program/meeting with their mentor. The training is designed to provide both with insight, etiquette, strategies, skills and tools necessary to significantly increase the chances for success.

The orientation program/meeting will be scheduled for each pair as soon as the protégé and mentor match is made.

Mentors and protégés will continue on, following the training/orientation, setting the parameters of their relationship and setting goals. Guides, tips, articles, websites and direct support will be available through the mentor's and protégé's handbooks, the resource guide and OASBO team.
